

ARE YOU REGISTERED?

To All Kendall County Voters,

Due to the 2010 census, Kendall County underwent some redistricting changes. In early December 2011 new voter registration cards were issued to all registered voters in Kendall County to inform voters of any changes that have been made to the districts in which they may vote on. The new voter registration cards have been printed with green ink and are the size of a postcard. Please sign your card and keep it in a safe location for reference in the upcoming 2012 General Elections.

This process also removes the names of individuals from our election rolls who have been reported as not eligible to vote for various reasons. Voter registration addresses are confirmed to be the most current through this process.

All Kendall County registered voters were issued new voter registration cards. If you did not receive a new card in the mail then you may not be registered to vote in Kendall County.

The following are some of the reasons we have received cards back from the Post Office:

- There was no mail receptacle
- The address was insufficient
- The PO Box has been closed
- The address was attempted but the name is not known
- The card is not deliverable as addressed

When a Voter's Registration card is stamped undeliverable and returned to the Kendall County Clerk by the United States Postal Service the voter's status must be changed to INACTIVE per State Statutes. If you are not registered as an ACTIVE voter you will be unable to vote.

Two Federal elections are scheduled to be held in 2012, the General Primary on Tuesday, March 20th and the General Election on Tuesday, November 6th. If you believe that you have not received a new voter's registration card, please contact the Kendall County Clerk's Voter Registration Department at once so that we can verify and, if necessary, update your voter registration status. My Staff and I will be more than happy to assist you.

Don't risk being turned away on Election Day! Please contact the Kendall County Clerk's Voter Registration Department as soon as possible to insure that you are a properly registered voter in Kendall County and are eligible to vote in these important upcoming elections.
