

Grace Period Registration & Voting

The voter registration deadline for the February 2, 2010 General Primary Election is Tuesday, January 5th at which time voter registration will close.

Pursuant to the Article 4 of the Illinois Election Code, a Grace Period for voter registration is available from January 6th through January 26th during which time individuals may register to vote or change their voting address during regular business hours at the Kendall County Clerk's Voter Registration office, 111 W Fox St, Rm 103, Yorkville, IL. Regular business hours are: Monday – Friday, 8:00am - 4:30pm.

Individuals registering during the Grace Period may vote only at the Kendall County Clerk's office prior to Election Day and are not eligible to cast a vote at the polling place on Election Day.

Online registration is not an option in the State of Illinois.

Voter Registration will resume on Thursday, February 4, 2010.

Voter Eligibility

To be eligible to register to vote, a person must:

- Be a U.S. citizen
- Be 18 years of age by the next election
- Reside in the precinct for 30 days prior to the next election.
- Bring 2 acceptable forms of ID when you register to vote

Government issued photo-identification is **required** to Early Vote.

February 2, 2010 at the appropriate polling location. Hours: 6am – 7pm.

Absentee Voting

Requests to receive an absentee ballot by mail may be directed to 630-553-4104 or 630-553-4105. The last day to receive a registered voter's completed application for a ballot by mail is January 28, 2010. In person Absentee Voting is available at the Kendall County Clerk's Voter Registration office, Rm 103, 111 W Fox Street, Yorkville, IL.

Write-In Voting

Write-In votes are only counted for persons who have filed notarized declarations of intent to be write-in candidates with the proper election authority or authorities. This is determined by State of Illinois Statute. According to the election calendar posted on the State Board of Election's website the deadline for filing such a document for the upcoming General Primary Election will be December 3, 2009.

Declaring Party Affiliation: The laws of the State of Illinois require all registered voters to declare their party affiliation when making application to vote in a Primary Election. Persons who chose not to make such a declaration will be allowed to vote on applicable Public Questions only.
