The sponsoring organization should notify Kendall County Administrative Services at least 30 days in advance of any scheduled event.

As defined in the Illinois Compiled Statutes, bicyclists are permitted, not intended users of the roadway. By acceptance of this Notice of Event, Kendall County in no way encourages, condones, or accepts responsibility for the action of the participants. Kendall County is not an active participant in this event and will enforce provisions of the event only as they apply to Illinois Law.

For all bicycling events, the sponsoring organization is encouraged to remind participants that they are required to follow the Rules of the Road as defined in Chapter II, Article XV of the Illinois Vehicle Code.

Temporary directional signs shall not be installed more than 24 hours in advance of the event and shall be removed within 24 hours after conclusion of the event.

No temporary directional signs may be attached to existing signs or traffic control devices, nor shall they in any way restrict the view or sight line of the traveling public.

Absolutely no paint shall be applied to the roadway pavement or other traffic control devices. Directional arrows consisting of chalk or spray chalk will be allowed provided no arrow exceeds 2 square feet and does not conflict with existing pavement markings or other traffic control devices.
