

NOTICE OF APPLICATION
FOR SITING OF A NEW POLLUTION CONTROL FACILITY (LANDFILL)
TO BE FILED WITH THE COUNTY BOARD OF KENDALL COUNTY, ILLINOIS

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that WASTE MANAGEMENT OF ILLINOIS, INC. ("WMII"), a Delaware corporation, whose address is 720 East Butterfield Road, Lombard, Illinois 60148 and KENDALL LAND AND CATTLE, L.L.C., an Illinois limited liability company, whose address is 23830 W. Main Street, Plainfield, Illinois 60544, will file a Site Location Application ("Application") with the County Board of Kendall County, Illinois ("Board") which will seek site location approval for the Willow Run Recycling and Disposal Facility ("Willow Run"). Willow Run is a solid waste landfill consisting of approximately 368 acres, of which approximately 134 acres will be the waste disposal area. The site is located approximately one and one-half miles east of Illinois Route 47 and one-half mile east of the intersection of Ashley Road and Whitewillow Road in unincorporated Kendall County.

Willow Run is a new pollution control facility (landfill), which will be owned and operated by WMII. Willow Run will receive general non-hazardous municipal solid waste, construction, demolition and such non-hazardous wastes as are specifically permitted by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, and any other governmental agency having jurisdiction over such matters. No hazardous waste, as defined by the Illinois Environmental Protection Act, will be accepted. The probable life of the landfill is 14.5 years.

The application will be submitted to the Kendall County Board on June 3, 2008. After filing, the Application will be made available for public inspection in the Office of the County Clerk, 111 Fox Street, Yorkville, Illinois 60560, and copies of the Application or any part thereof may be obtained from that Office upon payment of the actual cost of reproduction. An electronic copy of the Application will be available on the County website at www.co.kendall.il.us.

A public hearing will be held by the Board no sooner than ninety (90) days nor later than one hundred and twenty (120) days from the date the Application is filed. The time, date, and location of the hearing will be determined by the Board and notice to the public will be provided, as required by the Act.

Any person may file a written comment with the Board concerning the appropriateness of the proposed site for its intended purpose. In making its final determination, the Board shall consider any such comment received or postmarked not later than thirty (30) days after the date of the last public hearing. The hearing and public comment process is further detailed in the Amended and Restated Kendall County Site Approval Ordinance for Pollution Control Facilities, which may be found on the County website.
