The question is: I live in Kendall County.

My tax bill comes from Kendall County.

So I vote in Kendall County, right?

The answer is: Maybe -- If "Aurora" is part of your postal address.

You have a postal address that says Aurora, IL, but your property <u>is not</u> in the City of Aurora. Your street address is likely to have Route 30, Council or Gastville in it.

You vote at a Kendall County polling site.

You have a postal address that says Aurora, IL, and your property <u>is in</u> the City of Aurora. If you have a Voter's Registration card, it says Aurora Election Commission, You must vote at one of their polling sites.

The question is: Why would you do that?!

The answer is: Well, simply put, we didn't.

In the northeast corner of Kendall County, in Oswego Township, generally east of Route 30, the boundary line of the Aurora Election Commission for the City of Aurora, dips into Kendall County. Sympathetic to the confusion this boundary created for our Kendall County residents, Kendall County tried to have the boundary altered to follow the County border. The State has said the law doesn't allow us to make that change. Sorry!

Additionally, property owners may check the taxing districts on their property tax bill. If the City of Aurora is one of the districts you're paying taxes to, you should contact the Aurora Election Commission for answers to your voter related questions.
